The Department of Curriculum and Instruction offers programs that prepare candidates for initial teacher licensure in grades PreK-4th grade. Students enrolled in this program (BSE licensure) have two options. Students can (1) choose to enter the B.S.E. program on the University of Arkansas campus in Fayetteville, or (2) participate in this program through a partnership with NorthWest Arkansas Community College (NWACC) in Bentonville. The first two years of option 2 (NWACC/UA split) are offered at the community college and will culminate in an Associate's Degree.
