There is increasing demand for distance education opportunities in the specialized LL.M. Program market. Many law schools are developing new LL.M Programs with online courses and expanding their face-to-face LL.M. Programs to incorporate distance education. We anticipate that the demand for distance education will continue to expand in the future.

The LL.M. Program in Agricultural & Food Law is the only LL.M. Program in the United States that offers the LL.M. degree in this area of study. As was reported by our external reviewers in our Program Review last year, "Agricultural and Food Law is a developing area of law and is needed not only locally and nationally, but globally as well. The University of Arkansas program is ideally positioned to be a leader in this field and currently has that status."

Because we draw our students from a national and international market, our Program is particularly affected by the demand for distance education. We are currently losing talented applicants because they cannot relocate to Fayetteville for our face-to-face classes. Distance education offers not only growth opportunities, but will be necessary to maintain our leadership position in the developing marketplace.

We propose the development of a distance track for the LL.M Program in Agricultural & Food Law that will integrate our face-to-face delivery with distance education opportunities. This will allow us to increase the size of our enrollment while maintaining or increasing our high standards of admission. It will allow us to provide a greater range of classes and experiences to our students. And, it will allow our face-to-face students to interact and network with fellow-students throughout the U.S. and international countries who would not otherwise be able to attend our Program.

With the assistance of the UA Global Campus, our distance course offerings will offer a fully integrated classroom experience, taking advantage of state-of-the-art technology for synchronous video conferencing and the full range of interactive online educational experiences.
