Requirements for the Online Program

1. Online students will be restricted to 8 hours of on-campus classes within their first 30 hours. Thereafter, students can take up to 12 hours of on-campus classes per academic year, but no more than 35% of their total credit hours in online or self-paced (correspondence) may be used in total toward their degree. Ordinarily, no more than 60 hours of coursework can be transferred from the online degree program into an on-campus

degree program. Transfer credits for students that transfer into the online degree program will be evaluated the same as transfer credits for the on-campus program. For students that have transferred academic credits from other institutions, the percentage of total credit hours obtained at the University of Arkansas through regular (semester/summer) online and self-paced online (correspondence) courses for degree credit cannot exceed 35% of the total remaining hours needed to complete the degree after transfer credits are accounted for.
