	Justification		The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) recently revised its Model Tax Curriculum (MTC), which is intended as a guide for accounting educators in developing the tax component of accounting programs. The MTC represents the recommendations from the AICPA Tax Section regarding the core content that any student majoring in accounting should master, regardless of whether he or she ultimately chooses to work in the public accounting, industry, education, or nonprofit sectors. In keeping with the recommendations of the AICPA Task Force, the Accounting department proposes to modify their curriculum and require two undergraduate tax courses for all accounting majors to meet the overall learning objectives of the tax component of the AICPA's MTC.
