We're Formalizing Service Learning at University of Arkansas

Service learning courses will soon be formally recognized on campus.

The Committee has proposed the following for UA Service Learning Courses:

Definition:

Service learning is a credit bearing faculty directed teaching-learning experience that is course specific. Service Learning strengthens academic content knowledge and sense of civic responsibility. Students build critical thinking skills as they engage in experiential, community-based activities that are aligned with and integral to academic course work. At the same time, the community (real people in real situations) benefits from assistance that would otherwise not be available.



Service Learning Initiative

Criteria:

To qualify as service learning, a course must:

- Be approved through a faculty evaluation process
- Address a community need through formal collaboration
- Support attainment of one or more course learning objectives
- Demonstrate clear and articulated connection between service activity and course content
- Involve structured reflection
- Require a minimum of 5 hours of service per credit hour of course content
- Involve training for students before working with partners

Additional criteria may be added that are course or program specific.

Matrixes of Differences Among Service Learning, Community Service and Traditional Internships / Practicums

The committee has developed the following matrix to assist faculty, staff and students in distinguishing among activities that are truly service learning and those that are not. Oftentimes, community service and internship/practicum experiences may share <u>some</u> of the characteristics of service learning experiences. However, in order to qualify as true service learning on the UA campus, any experience must include the eight characteristics listed in the service learning column below. This means that some internship/practicum experiences will indeed receive SL designation but this will be done on a case by case basis.

Service Learning Designation

The University of Arkansas Service Learning Initiative Committee has been tasked with both developing minimum criteria for courses wishing to be designated as service learning courses on campus and then inventorying all those courses that meet the minimum requirements. Please note, requesting service learning designation does not replace the college level curriculum review process for new courses. Please contact your dean's offices for more details.

The Initiative is asking faculty to register their courses to provide a database for University of Arkansas faculty, students, and community partners. The Initiative will spread awareness regarding service learning opportunities and will work to find resources to enhance and expand current and future service learning opportunities. Registered courses will be marketed through the Service Learning website, as well as social media sites. Likewise, there will be an identified point of contact if funding or other resource opportunities align with the objectives of a particular course.
