

Interdisciplinary Studies Templates (fall 2014)

Below are options for creating majors by combining three minors. These options are divided into face-to-face and on-line pathways. Both the on-line and the face-to-face majors have professional tracks for students who want to enter the job market immediately upon graduating and post-graduate tracks for those who intend to pursue higher degrees in related fields.

These IDST "tracks" demonstrate the rigor of the interdisciplinary major, which requires students to take mostly 3000-4000-level course pathways designed by specialists in each discipline. The "tracks" also underscore the marketability of IDST as well as the intellectual integrity of interdisciplinary work as a whole.
