	Description and Justification of the Request		<p>The CHEM 4313 Bioanalytical Chemistry course option was added without formal approval of the entire Chemistry faculty and when it was proposed, it failed. Therefore, we are removing CHEM 4313 from the 3-4 hour requirement of CHEM 4213/4211L, CHEM 4123, or CHEM 4313.</p> <p>CHEM 5813/5843 is a graduate course and is the same course as CHEM 4813H/4843H. It is redundant and problematic to offer the graduate course to undergraduate students in lieu of the designated undergraduate course. Therefore, we are removing CHEM 5813/5843 from the 6 hour requirement of CHEM 5813 and CHEM 5843, CHEM 4813H and CHEM 4843H, or CHEM 3813 and CHEM 4723.</p>

Replaced Requirements paragraph with: Requirements for the COEHP College Honors include meeting all university, COEHP, and department degree requirements; completion of a minimum total of 32 honors hours; completion of honors requirements including preparation and oral defense of an honors thesis; and a minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5.</li> <li>3. Replaced Departmental Honors paragraph with specific course requirements for each department. In terms of internationalizing the college, this will happen in three ways.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. We will have 100 Chinese undergraduates each year in our college, significantly internationalizing our classrooms.</li> <li>2. Our faculty and PhD students will have the opportunity to teach in China since 6 of our core courses will be delivered in the summers in Suzhou.</li> <li>3. Once revenues begin to flow, scholarships will be set aside for a number of Walton College students to accompany our faculty in the summer to take some of these core courses in Suzhou, China.</li> </ol>
	Learning Outcomes	NA	Students will complete a BSBA with a major in Supply Chain Management.
	Description and Justification of the Request	Removed general description of program from program requirements.	<p>This program is a partnership between the Walton College and Suzhou University in Suzhou, China. The program is a 3+1 and students spend three years as an undergraduate at Suzhou University, and then transfer to the University of Arkansas for their final year, all as BSBA Supply Chain Management majors. They will ultimately receive a degree from both the U of A and Suzhou University. It should be noted that students must be in the top 12% of graduating high school seniors to be admitted to Suzhou University, and admission to this program is selective among that group.</p> <p>As required by university and Walton College regulations, students will complete all of their major courses here at the Walton College, and 59 of their hours will be U of A hours. The remainder will be transferred in. Of those 59 hours, 18 will be taught in the summer in China by our faculty and PhD students. It is this off-campus element that is the reason this program requires specific approvals beyond that of a simple transfer situation.</p> <p>The attachments include the Letter of Notification 12, the original Memorandum of Understanding (2013), an updated addendum to the Memorandum of Understanding, the articulation agreement (how courses will transfer and what courses students will be expected to complete upon transfer to the University of Arkansas), an academic plan (indicating which courses students will complete at which location and when), a list of transfer courses to be developed by Suzhou and approvals for transfer (including courses in ARSC and COEHP), and all syllabi that have been reviewed and approved for transfer credit.</p>
