Public Policy Leadership Concentration This concentration looks at the varied roles and responsibilities that policy leaders exercise in the design and leadership of agencies and organizations. Policy practice involves such skills as: the ability to understand the complexities of change leadership, strategic decision making under conditions of uncertainty, the use of advanced organizational analysis, managing programs and teams in inter-organizational environments at various levels of government and across policy areas. Practical exercises would include evaluation of existing agencies in terms of their ability to design and implement policies; develop the requisite leadership skills (policy entrepreneurs) and develop quality policies under resource-constrained conditions or conditions of conflict over values and goals (conflict resolution). Course of Study (12 hours)

Specific courses The student's program committee-will be selected aid the student-in consultation between the student and selecting appropriate electives as necessary.
