Accounting Students are encouraged to utilize <u>ACCT 310V</u> in the Spring of Year 4 for Internship Credit as a business elective (in combination with compressed sections of <u>ACCT 4673</u> and <u>ACCT 4963</u>). To do so requires the student to defer 3 credit hours of General Education electives to an alternative Fall, Spring, or Summer semester. This also strengthens the ability of the student to transition into the Masters of Accounting Program.
