Admission Requirements and Procedures for the Master of Science in Counseling Degree Program: Academic requirements include a 3.00 GPA on all undergraduate and also on any previous graduate course work. Applicants should submit a program application, GRE scores, three letters of professional recommendation, a writing sample, and a statement of professional goals to the Coordinator for Graduate Studies (GRAD 116). Applicants should first submit an application and official transcripts to the Graduate School. The applicant must be accepted by the Graduate School prior to consideration for admission into the Counseling Program. Top applicants will be invited for a personal interview with Counselor Education faculty. Completed application deadlines are September 15 for spring admission and January 15 for summer/fall admission.

Description of specific change	Justification for this change
Adding two new concentrations- Addiction Counseling and Rehabilitation Counseling.	The accreditation bodies for Rehabilitation Counseling and Counseling have merged and will now all be under the umbrella of CACREP (Council for accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Professions). Counseling and Rehabilitation will be merging into one program and we would like to add two new CACREP specialty tracks. One will be in Rehabilitation Counseling which will replace the previously offered Masters in Rehabilitation Counseling. We will also be adding one in addictions counseling. This will be the only program of this sort in Arkansas and will be a very marketable program.
Added names for School and Clinical Mental Health Counseling Concentrations.	These concentrations have previously existed but I added them so that they will now show up on the transcripts and specify which concentration a student is focusing on.
Changed Core to 36 and concentrations all to 24 hours.	To align more closely with our accreditation standards, we have changed our Core courses to 36 hours and made all four concentrations 24 hours. School counseling was previously a 48 hour program, but accreditation standards now require a 60 hour program so we have made this change to the school concentration as well.
