The Birth through Kindergarten program will prepare educators to work in settings that serve young children, including public schools, early intervention programs, child care and education centers, and residential placement centers. The BRKD program will meet the need for a teacher licensure program that leads to Arkansas' Integrated Birth through Kindergarten/Special Education teacher license, as set forth in Arkansas Department of Education Rules Regarding Teacher Licensure
