~~Admission to the Master's Degree: Admission~~ **Students must apply to the Master's Degree**
Students must apply to the UA Graduate School before consideration for admission. **The M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction will use a variety of inputs to determine the qualifications of applicants including: (1) prior undergraduate and graduate work, (2) curriculum vita that includes related experiences, (3) writing sample from prior educational or work setting, (4) statement of purpose that addresses the fit between the applicant's educational needs and the program's learning outcomes; and (5) two letters of recommendation that address the applicant's potential for graduate study. The GRE exam will be required for applicants with an undergraduate G.P.A. below 3.0 unless applicant has already successfully completed a graduate degree.**
~~In addition to those requirements, students must provide two letters of recommendation and a personal statement. This statement should discuss their reasons for pursuing the degree as well as a discussion of an area of curricular interest, which will be the focus of their program of study. In such cases, students will form an advisory committee and then propose, write, and defend a thesis project. The successful defense of the thesis will represent the comprehensive exam for the M.Ed. degree.

Students who choose the thesis option are not required to complete [CIED 5013](#) or [CIED 5273](#) or [CIED 5983](#), but must take six hours of master's thesis credit ([CIED 600V](#)) in place of these two courses.

All of the courses in this current iteration of the program are already offered and taught on a regular basis. Adding flexibility to the Interest Area allows students to supplement the core offerings with specific interest areas, while also allowing for the variability of course offerings that is typical for these areas.</p>
