The Entrepreneurship Undergraduate MicroCertificate will teach students the core tools necessary to start a new business venture, allowing them to learn the process by the practical building of their own new venture. The program aims to equip students with the knowledge, skills, and abilities to improve the probability of commercial success for an innovative new product and service of their choosing. The CiE program will consist of three 3-hour courses taken over the timeframe of at least two semesters.

The curriculum will cover the core principles of the Lean Canvas methodology and the use of Customer Discovery and other forms of research to validate the magnitude of the problem, determine the most likely solution for success and develop the business & financial models in preparation for investment. Students will bring problems they want to solve to these classes with the goal to vet potential solutions and prepare business models for presentation to investors, either through collegiate-based business pitch competitions or other means.
