The program is being revised to meet the requirements for the yearlong residency required by the Arkansas Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. Previously, CATE students completed a spring only residency.	To meet the requirements for licensure by ADE DESE, students will begin their yearlong residency in the fall 2025 semester.
CATE 40203 Classroom Management will be removed from the program of study. The CATE students will enroll in SEED 40203 Classroom Management Concepts. SEED 40203 is a similar course.	The change is being made to maximize resources.
CATE 41006 Teaching Residency I is a new course. This course is the fall residency.	CATE students will begin the residency in the fall semester. This course is the fall residency course.
CATE 40612 Teaching Internship title was changed to Teaching Residency II.	We are moving away from the terms "internship" and "student teaching" and moving toward using the term "residency."
