There is a significant shortage of teachers in Arkansas and the nation in the areas of English as a Second Language (ESL) and Special Education (SPED). The Arkansas Department of Education allows teachers with an Arkansas teacher license to add ESL and SPED as endorsements. The proposed changes in the Childhood Education Program will result in graduates from the University of Arkansas P-4 teacher preparation program to add either ESL or SPED to their P-4 license. This will make graduates much more marketable as well as provide local education agencies with teachers prepared to teach ESL and special education.
