Stephen Langsner called the meeting to order at 2:33 P.M.

1. Jean Mitchell introduced Lisa Kulczak who will replace Kathryn Baker as the Registrar's Office representative.
2. The minutes for April 27, 2007 were approved.
3. Course Change Proposals:
 - A. Except for the honors courses in the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, the undergraduate course change proposals ([Table A](#)) were approved without opposition and forwarded for the September, 2007 Faculty Senate and the August Graduate Council meeting.

Chuck Adams explained the reasoning behind limiting the honors courses in Arts and Sciences to Arts and Sciences students only. He informed the committee that the Arts and Sciences honors students could not register for their honors classes because the classes were being filled by non-Arts and Sciences honors students. Thus limiting the access of the other students to the classes would permit the Arts and Sciences honors students to complete their honors requirements.

Dean McMath presented a handout, [Attachment A](#), that contained data supporting an opposing view of student enrollment availability. Committee members from other colleges expressed concern that if the proposed changes were implemented then their honors programs would be negatively impacted. The other college members also were sympathetic with the reasoning for the requested change but could not vote for the proposal. All changes for the honors courses in the Fulbright College of Arts and

Sciences were rejected by the committee by a majority vote.

The committee felt that a negative vote was not sufficient and that a memorandum of concern and support for the honors program in Arts and Sciences be forwarded to the Provost's Office. The memorandum, [Attachment B](#), was forwarded the following week after being circulated to the committee. Provost Bob Smith's response is contained in Attachment C.

- B. The graduate and dual level courses ([Tables B and C](#)) were approved without opposition and forwarded to the Graduate Council.
4. Old Business: None
5. New Business:
- A. A program change for the Bumpers College of Agricultural, Food and Life Sciences – Department of Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1A](#)) was presented by Donna Graham. The proposal adds courses HESC 4653, Global Travel and Tour Management, and AFLS 3313H, Honors Global Issues, to the core course listing and controlled electives listing, AGEC 402V, Special Topics, was deleted from the curriculum, and other small changes were also approved. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the September, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.
 - B. A program change for the Walton College of Business – Department of Marketing and Logistics ([Table 2](#), [Attachment 2A](#) and [Attachment 2B](#)) was presented by Bill Curington. The program change proposed to eliminate the Masters of Transportation and Logistics Management degree. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the August Graduate Council meeting.

ATTACHMENT A

1. There is undoubtedly some pent up demand for spots in some Honors sections of Fulbright core courses. For this semester, looking only at Honors sections with enrollment caps of 15 or more students, 38 sections are at or above capacity. But 82 sections (68%) are *below* capacity, with a total of 802 seats available (That figure excludes one odd-looking lecture course where only 10 of 115 seats were taken.) No doubt there is some inelasticity in the system of creating sections, and these figures are current as of two weeks ago, but this looks more like a resource allocation and registration management problem than a problem of insufficient supply.
2. Of the students who are actually enrolled in Fulbright College Honors classes this semester, 453 (18.77%) are from colleges other than Fulbright. But when you look at the enrolled students by Honors/non-Honors status, it turns out that 464 (19.22%) are not Honors students, and of that group almost three-fourths are from Fulbright College. (See table below) The practice has been to allow non-Honors students to enroll in Honors classes on a space-available basis, which I strongly support, particularly if their academic record predicts that they can do the work. But why reverse the current practice and give non-Honors students priority over Honors students from other colleges, particularly when the Honors College is paying for a portion of these classes?

3. To elaborate on that last point, the Honors College continues the practice of funding sections of Arts and Sciences core courses at a level sufficient to satisfy the increased demand, primarily from the growth of Honors Programs in other colleges. (Historical footnote: When the Honors College was established Fulbright College was already providing Honors course access to students from the new Honors Program in the Walton College of Business.) As in the past, this year we have met every request from Fulbright College to fund additional sections, without regard to the home college of the students involved, using state funds made available to us for this purpose. The one exception was a Calculus class for which no instructor could be found.

This memorandum is to inform you that the University Course and Programs Committee (UCPC) did not approve a request by the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences that would have restricted all core and upper level Honors designated courses taught within the Fulbright College to Fulbright College Honors students only. Although the proposed change was not approved, the UCPC membership unanimously suggested that a memorandum of concern be transmitted to your office. A very real concern was expressed by the Fulbright College Representatives at this meeting that at the current rate of enrollment growth in college honors programs university-wide, the Fulbright College is stretched to the breaking point by trying to provide honors requirements for these programs.

The other college representatives of the UCPC supported the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences' argument that additional support for the provision of all honors courses provided by Fulbright College was needed. Moreover, they acknowledged that a similar dearth of resources exists in their own respective honors programs.

As a consequence of Fulbright's request, UCPC's denial and the discussion that followed, the committee recommends that a University wide group of administrators, the Dean of the Honors College, and Honors College representatives be organized to suggest and assist with changes that affect honors programs campus-wide.
