Stephen Langsner called the meeting to order at 2:31 P.M.

1. The minutes for July 27, 2007 were approved.
2. Course Change Proposals:
 1. A. The undergraduate and School of Law course change proposals ([Table A and D](#)) were approved without opposition and forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.
 2. B. The graduate and dual level courses ([Tables B and C](#)) were approved without opposition and forwarded to the Graduate Council.

4. New Business:

- A. A. An undergraduate program change for the Bumpers College of Agricultural, Food and Life Sciences – Department of Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness – BS, Agricultural Business ([Table 1, Attachment 1A](#)) was presented by Donna Graham. The proposal will allow students who are majors in the Agricultural Business Management and Marketing concentration to select two courses from four 4000 level AGEC courses; AGEC 4313, AGEC 4323, AGEC 4113 AND AGEC 4373. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.
- B. An undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance – BSE, Recreation – ([Table 2, Attachments 2A – 2N](#)) was presented by Steve Langsner. The proposal requested the deletion of all concentrations under the BSE in Recreation. These concentrations were meant for advisor use only and

were never intended to be listed as concentration areas. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.

C. An undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance – BSE, Health Science – ([Table 2, Attachments 2O – 2Q](#)) was presented by Dean Gorman. The proposal requested the deletion of all concentrations under the BSE in Health Science. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.

D. An undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Curriculum and Instruction- BSE, Technology Education concentration – ([Table 2, Attachment 2R](#)) was presented by Betsy Orr. The proposal requested that ETEC 2001/2002L Educational Technology and Lab be removed from the required course of study and replaced with three hours of elective course credit selected from the TEED elective course selections. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.

E. An undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Curriculum and Instruction- BSE, Home Economics Education concentration – ([Table 2, Attachment 2S](#) and [Attachment 2T](#)) was presented by Betsy Orr. The proposal requested the elimination of the Home Economics Education concentration since the concentration has been renamed Family and Consumer Science Education. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.

F. An undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Curriculum and Instruction- BSE, Technical Learning Specialists concentration – ([Table 2, Attachment 2U](#) and [Attachment 2V](#)) was presented by Betsy Orr. The proposal requested the elimination of the Technical Learning Specialist concentration. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.

G. An undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Curriculum and Instruction- BSE, Trade and Technical Field Based concentration – ([Table 2, Attachment 2W](#) and [Attachment 2X](#)) was presented by Betsy Orr. The proposal requested the elimination of the Trade and Technical Field Based concentration since the concentration has been renamed Competency-Based Teacher Development. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October 10, 2007 Faculty Senate meeting.

H. A graduate program change for the Department of Curriculum and Instruction- MAT, Vocational Education ([Table 3, Attachment 3A](#) and [Attachment 3B](#)) was presented by Betsy Orr. The proposal requested the elimination of the Vocational Education Master of Arts in Teaching. Students may now qualify for teacher licensure in those areas by completing the undergraduate CATE program. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October Graduate Council meeting.

I. A graduate program change for the Department of Curriculum and Instruction- MED, Secondary Education ([Table 3](#), [Attachment 3C](#) and [Attachment 3D](#)) was presented by Betsy Orr. The proposal requested the addition of a new concentration “Career and Technical Education” to the Master of Education in Secondary Education degree program. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October Graduate Council meeting.

J. A graduate program change for the Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance - MAT, Physical Education ([Table 3](#), [Attachment 3E](#), [Attachment 3F](#) and [Attachment 3G](#)) was presented by Dean Gorman. The proposal requested the elimination of the Physical Education Master of Arts in Teaching. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October Graduate Council meeting.

K. A graduate program change for the Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance - MS, Health Science ([Table 3](#), [Attachments 3H through 3M](#)) was presented by Dean Gorman. The proposal requested the elimination of all concentrations for the Master of Science in Health Science degree program. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the October Graduate Council meeting.

The agricultural business degree program provides education suited to career opportunities in farm management, agricultural business management, and agricultural marketing in both the domestic and international areas.

Managers of farms and agricultural businesses are continually required to make organizational and operational decisions. The basic skills and knowledge needed for making sound decisions are provided by the agricultural business curriculum. Students may elect to specialize in areas compatible with their personal objectives, depending upon the extent of accounting and business orientation desired.

Students educated in agricultural business are in demand for positions in agricultural industries, farm operation, marketing agencies, agricultural service organizations, state and federal agencies, and numerous other positions. For those who go on to graduate school, teaching and research positions are available with land grant colleges as well as with other institutions. Three concentrations are available to meet career objectives:

- A. Agricultural Business Management and Marketing (ABMM)
- B. Pre-Law, for students preparing to attend law school (PRLW)
- C. Agricultural Economics, which emphasizes quantitative and analytical skills to prepare students for graduate school (AGEC).

The program of recreation is designed to prepare candidates for a variety of career opportunities in the field of recreation and parks. Career opportunities may include park and recreation directors for a city, sports management, fitness center managers, state and national park managers, camp administrators, or work in YMCAs, Boys and Girls Clubs, or other youth-serving agencies. Graduates of this program should be well prepared to enter the recreational workforce at an entry level position or pursue graduate studies in such areas as recreation management, sport management, or other allied health professional schools.

The candidate for the Bachelor of Science in Education degree with a major in recreation will select 18-21 credit hours of professional electives under the guidance of their major advisor. Professional electives allow students to focus on specific areas of interest designed to meet their individual career goals.

All students must complete the University Core requirements as listed on page 40. In addition, all students must take the required general studies for the recreation core requirements listed below. Recreation majors must obtain a “C” or better in all courses beginning with the alpha code RECR. To enroll in RECR 440V, students must have a 2.50 GPA or better in RECR core and concentration courses. Many courses in the recreation curriculum are taught in sequential order. Please check catalog course descriptions for prerequisites.

There are several experiential requirements within the recreation core. Students are required to complete three practicum experiences (RECR 201V) in three different agencies. Each experience totals 45 hours. A more intense experience of an internship (RECR 440V) requires a minimum of 400 hours or work full time for 12-15 weeks in an agency with a qualified park and recreation professional. Students in the recreation program must obtain one instructor-level certification and a second certification in another area of expertise, three certifications which must be appropriate to recreation and be pre-approved by the recreation program. For additional information regarding these certifications see a recreation faculty adviser. Certifications must be valid at the time of graduation and be completed before a grade will be assigned in RECR 4013 Contemporary Issues in Leisure. Examples of these certifications include, but are not limited to, water safety instructor, aerobics instructor, American Red Cross canoeing instructor, first-aid instructor, and hunter safety instructor. A minimum of 124 hours are required for graduation in the major of recreation.

An undergraduate minor in recreation is also available to students enrolled in other colleges. Students with interests related to the recreation profession such as business, biology, human environmental science, or horticulture may elect the 15-hour minor. This minor could enhance future career opportunities.

The proposed blended (online and on campus) program will serve a diverse group of students who seek a program that provides a majority of instruction through online delivery with some on-campus course requirements. All credit hours will be taken from the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. Participants must complete the University of Arkansas residency requirements of the Graduate School.

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction in the College of Education and Health Professions presently offers three Master of Education degrees: Master of

Education in Elementary Education, Master of Education in Secondary Education, and Master of Education in Special Education. Career and Technical Education was previously housed in the Department of Rehabilitation, Human Resources and Communication Disorders. In that department, the Career and Technical Education (CATE) program was included in the Master of Education in Workforce Development Education program. With the reorganization of the college in spring 2007, CATE was relocated to the Department of Curriculum and Instruction. Presently, in this department, there is not a graduate degree program available that has an emphasis in career and technical education for CATE students. The Master of Education degree in Secondary Education presently has four areas of concentration: Option 1 - Advanced Certification (mathematics, science, social studies, English, etc.); Option 2 – Secondary Curriculum and Instruction; Option 3 – Specialist Certification; and Option 4 – ESL Endorsement. The current M.Ed. in Secondary Education does not meet requirements for state licensure and is designed for experienced teachers. This proposal will include an option (Option 5) for students interested in advanced studies in career and technical education or teacher licensure.

Many of the prospective students in this program have existing degrees in related fields of studies. After entering the job market in business and industry or family related fields, the prospective students change their career focus to education. For some students, this is what they have always desired but other factors enter into their reasons for not pursuing teacher education. This past year the business education program had ten student teachers. Of the ten students, five were certification only. Certification only means that the student already possesses a bachelor's degree but did not take the professional education courses required for teacher licensure. These students were in careers in business and industry and then changed their career focus. This data is consistent with previous years.

Increased primary and secondary student enrollment, recent expansion of secondary CTE programs, teacher attrition, and the decreasing number of universities offering CTE teacher education degrees have led to a nationwide shortage of teachers in career and technical fields (Gray & Daugherty, 2004). Anecdotal studies more than twenty years old illustrate a shortage of career and technical teachers across the United States, so attracting students into the profession is not a new problem (Edmunds, 1980; Miller, 1978). However, some reports now suggest that the nation is in the early stages of the worst ever teacher shortage (NGA Center for Best Practices, 2000). Compounding this problem, at the same time as the number of entering CTE teacher education students continues to decline, the number of secondary students enrolling in CTE programs is on the upswing nationally. One in four of all students are enrolled in CTE programs; with the majority going on to college (Gray, 2004). According to the Occupational Outlook Handbook 2006 – 2007, qualified career and technical education teachers are currently in demand in a variety of fields at both the middle school and secondary school levels. Nationally, public school districts will hire a total of 2.2 million new public elementary and secondary school teachers to

accommodate increased student enrollment (NGA Center for Best Practices, 2000).

The concern for the decline in qualified teachers in CTE is documented in several studies (i.e. American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences, 2006; Bell, 2001; Camp, 2000; Werhan & Way, 2006). According to a report by Joerger and Bremer the greatest need is in special education but there are also acute teacher shortages in science, mathematics, and career and technical education (Joerger & Bremer, 2001).

The objective of the Career and Technical Education concentration is to prepare students for advanced studies in career and technical education *or* to prepare students in the instruction of teaching for initial licensure in Arkansas.

CATE 5543: Technology for Teaching and Learning

The CATE program is based on the Scholar-Practitioner model and the seven tenets adopted by the Professional Education Unit.

The program will be offered online with some on-campus only classes. The CATE courses are developed for online instruction that do not require site-specific locations. The proposed concentration in Career and Technical Education requires 24 hours of online courses.

14. **Explain in detail the distance delivery procedures to be used:**

The online instruction includes discussions made possible with the classroom management system program BlackBoard. The classroom management system has the capability of a virtual classroom which allows on-line interaction among

students and their instructors on a real-time basis. Email and telephone conversations provide additional student contact.

Prerequisites to Degree Program: For acceptance to the master's degree programs, the program area requires in addition to the general requirements for admission to the Graduate School, an undergraduate degree in Health Science or in a related field and the following admission standards: an overall undergraduate GPA of 3.00 (or if the overall undergraduate GPA is between 2.70 and 2.99, the student must have a 3.00 GPA on the last 60 hours of undergraduate course work, excluding student teaching, or a GRE score of 1000 on the combined verbal and quantitative parts of the general test).

Requirements for the Master of Science Degree: Candidates for the Master of Science degree in Health Science must complete 27 semester hours of graduate work and a thesis or 33 semester hours without a thesis. The corporate health promotion concentration requires 39 semester hours of graduate work and a thesis or 45 semester hours without a thesis. Students selecting the non-thesis option are required to complete three hours of HLSC 589V Independent Research. In addition to the program requirements listed below, all degree candidates must successfully complete a written comprehensive examination. A graduate GPA of 3.00 or higher is required for graduation.

An application should include identification of applicant's objectives, supportive background information including three letters of recommendation supporting the applicant's ability to successfully pursue a Ph.D. in health science; a GPA of at least 3.00 on all graduate course work; and an acceptable score on the Graduate Record Examinations (GRE). Additional prerequisites may be prescribed after review of application materials. Furthermore, applicants who present a GRE score of 1200 or greater on the combined verbal/quantitative portions, a GRE writing score of 5.5 or greater, a minimum overall GPA of 3.85 and faculty approval may apply for admission to the Ph.D. Health Science program after completion of their bachelor's degree.

Requirements for the Doctor of Philosophy Degree: A minimum of 96 graduate hours beyond the bachelor's degree is required. A doctoral advisory committee will be established by the student in consultation with the Coordinator of Graduate Study during the first semester of enrollment subsequent to acceptance into the degree program. The student, in conjunction with the advisory committee, will define the program of study. The degree program requires successful completion of candidacy examinations, an acceptable dissertation, and an oral defense of the dissertation.
