Stephen Langsner called the meeting to order at 2:30 P.M.

1. The minutes for October 24, 2008 were approved.
2. Course Change Proposals:
 - A. Undergraduate and School of Law course change proposals ([Tables A and D](#)) were approved without opposition and forwarded for the December 2008 Faculty Senate meeting.
 - B. Graduate course and Dual course change proposals ([Tables B and C](#)) were approved without opposition and will forwarded for the December 2008 Graduate Council meeting.
 - C. Courses with no Enrollment in the last five years – to remain active – [Table E](#) - was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 2008 Graduate Council meeting.
 - D. Courses with no Enrollment in the last five years – to be inactivated – [Table F](#) - was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 2008 Graduate Council meeting.
3. Old Business:

Proposed undergraduate program change that was tabled during the October 24, 2008 meeting for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Curriculum and Instruction

– EELBS – BSE, Elementary Education ([Table 2](#), [Attachment 2A](#)) was removed from consideration by the Department of Curriculum and Instruction. The proposal was resubmitted under a different program proposal change.

4. New Business:

- A. Items (a) through (r) were presented by Chuck Adams as a group. The committee was asked if any item needed to be removed and considered separately. No item was pulled from the grouping. The items are listed below:
- a. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Fulbright Interdisciplinary Studies – Combined Major in Asian Studies ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1A](#) and [Attachment 1B](#)). Proposal requested the addition of a new combined major in Asian Studies.
 - b. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Fulbright Deans Office – All Bachelor of Arts Degrees ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1C](#)). Proposal requested to add MATH 2033 as an option for the upper level Fulbright core mathematics requirement.
 - c. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Art – ARTBFA – BFA, Art – ARED Concentration ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1D](#)). Proposal requested to require ARED 3613 and move course offerings in the eight semester plan.
 - d. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Art – ARTBFA – BFA, Art ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1E](#)). Proposal requested to modify standards for remaining in the BFA degree program.
 - e. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Art – ART-M – Minor in Art Studio ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1F](#) and [Attachment 1G](#)). Proposal requested to eliminate the minor in Studio Art.
 - f. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – School of Social Work – SCWKBA – BSW, Social Work ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1H](#)). Proposal requested to allow Math 2033 to serve as a Fulbright core mathematics requirement.
 - g. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Biological Sciences – BIOLBA, Biology ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1I](#)). Proposal requested to remove BIOL 2504 and replace it with BIOL 4404 as the Morphology area requirement.

- h. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry – CHEMBS - BS, Chemistry - International Option ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1J](#)). Proposal requested to insert a statement regarding the English proficiency requirement of the Atlantis program.
- i. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Communication – COMMBA – BA, Communication ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1K](#)). Proposal requested that a grade of “C” or better be earned in each of the following courses: COMM 2333, 3343, 3443, and 3673. Also, that a grade of “C” or better be earned for the research paper used to satisfy the Senior Writing Requirement.
- j. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of History – HISTBA – BA, History ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1L](#)). Proposal requested changes to the course listing for the 36 hours of history courses required for the major.
- k. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Fulbright College Honors Studies ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1M](#)). Proposal requested changes to the Four-Year Scholars curriculum which gives students the choice between honors and non-honors courses, with a minimum amount of honors credits in the humanities, social sciences and natural sciences.
- l. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Fulbright Interdisciplinary Studies – Combined Major in Latin American Studies ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1N](#)). Proposal requested to add many courses to the option area and change the name of the combined major to Latin American and Latino Studies.
- m. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Fulbright Interdisciplinary Studies – LAST-M – Minor in Latin American Studies ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1O](#) and [Attachment 1P](#)). Proposal requested to change the name of the minor in Latin American Studies to Latin American and Latino Studies.
- n. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Political Science – LGST-M – Minor in Legal Studies ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1Q](#)). Proposal requested that the total required credit hours be reduced from 18 to 15 and the courses PLSC 3242, 4253, and 4263 no longer be required.
- o. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Political Science – PADMBS – BS, Public

Administration ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1R](#) and [Attachment 1S](#)). Proposal requested to eliminate the BS in Public Administration.

- p. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Mathematics – MATH-M – Minor in Mathematics ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1T](#)). Proposal requested that MATH 3093 be allowed as an option to MATH 3083 for the Minor in Mathematics requirement
- q. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Mathematics – MATHBA – BA, Mathematics ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1U](#)). Proposal requested that MATH 3093 be allowed as an option to MATH 3083 for the Mathematics BA degree.
- r. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences – Department of Mathematics – MATHBS – BS, Mathematics ([Table 1](#), [Attachment 1V](#)). Proposal requested that MATH 3093 be allowed as an option to MATH 3083 for the Mathematics BS degree.

All items passed without any opposition and will be forwarded for the December Faculty Senate meeting.

- B. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Curriculum and Instruction, ELELBS – BSE, Elementary Education ([Table Two](#), [Attachment 2B](#)) was presented by Tom Smith. The program change requested to drop ARED 3603 and replace it with CIED 4113, and change the entrance requirements from a 2.5 to a 2.7 for the program. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 2008 Faculty Senate meeting.
- C. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance - HLSCBS – BSE, Health Science ([Table Two](#), [Attachment 2C](#)) was presented by Steve Langsner. The program change requested to change chemistry and English course options for electives. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 2008 Faculty Senate meeting.
- D. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance – KINSBS – BSE, Kinesiology – P-12 Concentration ([Table Two](#), [Attachment 2D](#)) was presented by Susan Mayes. The program change requested to clarify requirements for the student internship cohort and several course options. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 2008 Faculty Senate meeting.

- E. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions – Mann School of Nursing – NURSBS – BSN, Nursing ([Table Two](#), [Attachment 2E](#)) was presented by Nancy Smith-Blair. The program change requested to modify requirements for the Biology and Chemistry course work. The program change was approved without opposition and be forwarded for the December 2008 Faculty Senate meeting.
- F. Proposed graduate program change for the Department of Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness – AGECMS – MS, Agricultural Economics ([Table Three](#), [Attachment 3A](#) and [Attachment 3B](#)) was presented by Bruce Ahrendsen and Steve Halbrook. The program change requested the addition of a new option as part of a joint venture with a consortium of six universities in the E. U. and the University of Florida. The program change was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December Graduate Council meeting.
- G. Proposed graduate program change for the Graduate Interdisciplinary Studies – PUBPPH– PhD, Public Policy ([Table Three](#), [Attachment 3C](#) and [Attachment 3D](#)) was presented by Brinck Kerr. The program change requested to add a new concentration, Policy Studies in Aging. The program change was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December Graduate Council meeting.
- H. Proposed graduate program change for the Graduate Interdisciplinary Studies – Graduate Certificate Program - Preparing for the Professoriate ([Table Three](#), [Attachment 3E](#) and [Attachment 3F](#)) was presented by Steve Langsner. The program change requested to add a new graduate level certificate, Preparing for the Professoriate. The program change was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December Graduate Council meeting.

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction also offers the B.S.E. in elementary education licensure program. Students enrolled in this program typically complete their first two years of study on another campus prior to admission to the program. The final two years of the program are University of Arkansas courses offered at an off-campus location.

Academic Regulations for Elementary Education Majors are as follows:

Stage I: Admission

1. Enroll in the undergraduate B.S.E. program in childhood education.
2. Complete first two years of study at Northwest Arkansas Community College (NWACC).
3. Establish a GPA of 2.70 or better in the pre-requisite courses.
5. Pass Praxis I (deadline for submission of scores is April 15 prior to Fall enrollment).

Stage II: Program Progression

1. Register for coursework.
2. Eligibility to enroll in subsequent program courses is contingent upon successful screening as well as meeting ALL Stage I requirements.
3. Maintain a GPA of 2.7 or better.
4. Pass Praxis II (Early Childhood Content Knowledge in the junior year AND Principles of Learning and Teaching: Early Childhood in the senior year.

NOTE: All professional education courses in CIED must have a grade of "C" or better. A passing score on required Praxis exams and a GPA of 2.7 or better are required for enrollment in upper-division professional education courses. No teaching methods courses may be taken by correspondence.

A. Student Interests:

We conducted a survey of students enrolled in Chinese language classes in Spring 2008 and asked them the following question: "If the University of Arkansas were to offer a Major in Asian Studies, would you be interested in it?"

12 out of 20 students surveyed in CHIN 1013 (Elementary Chinese), 8 out of 11 students surveyed in CHIN 2003 (Intermediate Chinese I), 25 out of 43 students surveyed in CHIN 2013 (Intermediate Chinese II) and 5 out of 5 students surveyed in the CHIN 3003 (Conversational Chinese) class answered positively to the question. This provides indication of strong student demand for a major in Asian Studies.

B. Corporate Demands

We surveyed the International Division of Tyson Foods, Inc. about the need for a new major in Asian Studies.

According to the Director of the International Division of Tyson Foods, Inc., Tyson is currently planning to establish two new plants in China. Once these plants are established, more personnel with knowledge in the Chinese language and business environment will be needed to analyze data transmitted from China back to Tyson's corporate headquarter in Springdale, Arkansas. Currently the International Division has to hire someone to translate the documents and data transmitted from China first before they can be analyzed. Having employees with command of the Chinese language would help to alleviate this problem. Therefore, prospective employees with both knowledge of the Chinese language and culture and training in the areas of business operation, accounting, finance, nutrition, acquisition, engineering, sales and marketing, and technical services can greatly enhance their prospect of employment with Tyson. Employees with such combination of skills are also expected to improve their chances of promotion and salary raises with Tyson.

5. PROGRAM SUMMARY

The State of Arkansas has seen an expansion in economic exchanges with Asia in recent years. This is reflected not only in the expansion of the operations of local companies such as Wal-Mart and Tyson in the Chinese market and the growing amount of goods that Wal-Mart sources from China, but also by the increasing investment of Japanese corporations and their subsidiaries in the State. The rapid growth of the Asian economies created tremendous opportunities for local businesses and brought an increasing number of residents originating from Asia to Northwest Arkansas. For example, Wal-Mart, whose headquarter is located just 20 miles from Fayetteville, the main UA campus, has increasingly sourced its products from China and contributes to about one percent of China's GDP today. Moreover, a growing number of Japanese corporations and their subsidiaries find Arkansas an attractive U.S. state for investment, as evidenced by Wal-Mart's business partnership with Seiyu (a Japanese supermarket franchise), the October 2003 announcement by Eakas Corporation (a U.S. affiliate of Sakae Riken Kogyo Co. Ltd. in Japan) to build a new auto parts manufacturing factory in the City of Wynne, AR, and the July 2004 announcement by Hino Motors, Ltd. (a major Japanese truck maker) to build a new truck parts plant near the City of Marion. Additionally, state government officials predict that more investment by Japanese corporations and their subsidiaries are forthcoming.

A major in Asian studies will greatly enhance University of Arkansas students' future employability with U.S. corporations with substantial business activities with their Asian partners. This employability will increase further if the degree they receive from the program is specifically designed to address the needs of their future employers.

The growing business ties between Arkansas and Asia described above justify the need for an interdisciplinary program in Asian Studies at the undergraduate level. Such a program will contribute to the State of Arkansas by enabling home-grown students to demonstrate to prospective employers a combination of advanced language skills in Chinese or Japanese, the capacity to employ these skills for business purposes, and a sensitivity to and appreciation of the Asian cultures and societies in which these corporations operate. A solid and sustainable growth in the number of students with such skills ought to help service the need of local businesses interested in expanding their ties with the Asia-Pacific region. Therefore, the proposed program would help to service the needs of the State of Arkansas by providing a unique undergraduate experience to our students that is simultaneously geared towards the needs of local employers.

Moreover, the development of a combined major in Asian Studies ought to help meet the growing student demands for such a degree program. The University of Arkansas currently offers a minor in Asian Studies (AIST). However, the AIST minor can no longer satisfy the growing enrollment needs of our students. The rapid expansion of our Chinese and Japanese language programs, in particular, has generated a growing number of students seeking a comprehensive degree in Asia to complement their language skills. For example, enrollment in the Japanese language program has increased from 65 in Fall 2000 to more than 170 in Fall 2004. Enrollment in our Chinese language program has similarly increased to well over 100 by the same period. The creation of a major in Asian Studies will therefore allow us to train students with not only advanced language skills, but also sound knowledge of the history, society, politics, and culture of Asia, which will in turn make them more competitive in the job market.

The proposed major will draw on the strengths of our faculty in various academic disciplines to offer an interdisciplinary education to our students. The major will represent an expansion of our existing minor and offers our students the opportunity to choose a wider range of courses to satisfy their degree needs.

The current curriculum of the AIST minor is sufficient to satisfy the needs of the major. The following sections will list in greater detail existing resources available to support the program. 12 out of 20 students surveyed in CHIN 1013 (Elementary Chinese), 8 out of 11 students surveyed in CHIN 2003 (Intermediate Chinese I), 25 out of 43 students surveyed in CHIN 2013 (Intermediate Chinese II) and 5 out of 5 students surveyed in the CHIN 3003 (Conversational Chinese) class answered positively to the question. This provides indication of strong student demand for a major in Asian Studies.

B. Corporate Demands

We surveyed the International Division of Tyson Foods, Inc. about the need for a new major in Asian Studies.

According to the Director of the International Division of Tyson Foods, Inc., Tyson is currently planning to establish two new plants in China. Once these plants are established, more personnel with knowledge in the Chinese language and

business environment will be needed to analyze data transmitted from China back to Tyson's corporate headquarter in Springdale, Arkansas. Currently the International Division has to hire someone to translate the documents and data transmitted from China first before they can be analyzed. Having employees with command of the Chinese language would help to alleviate this problem. Therefore, prospective employees with both knowledge of the Chinese language and culture and training in the areas of business operation, accounting, finance, nutrition, acquisition, engineering, sales and marketing, and technical services can greatly enhance their prospect of employment with Tyson. Employees with such combination of skills are also expected to improve their chances of promotion and salary raises with Tyson.

As of this time, no employer tuition assistance is provided.

Tatsuya Fukushima (B.A., Kanto Gakuin University, 1988; Ph.D., Oklahoma State University, 2000). Fukushima joined the University of Arkansas in 2000 and is currently Assistant Professor of Japanese. He is the coordinator of the Japanese language program. His specializations include discourse analysis, sociolinguistics, computer-mediated communication, second language acquisition, and computer-assisted language learning. His research focuses on linguistic patterns of sociocultural interactions, political dialogues, and computer-mediated communication. He is currently working on several journal articles and conference papers on computer-assisted language learning as well as discourse analyses of public speeches by Japanese elected officials.

Elizabeth Markham is a Research Professor of Ethnomusicology and is also associated with the International Center for the Study of Early Asian and Middle Eastern Musics. She works on musics of East Asia and is interested particularly in Sino-Japanese modal theory and in the deciphering and analysis of the earliest musical notations for Japanese court songs and Buddhist chants. Wider interests include prosody and melody, and comparative music theory. Before coming to

Arkansas in 2000, she held various research positions in Europe: Alexander von Humboldt Research Fellow in Oriental Studies at the University of Würzburg (Germany), Research Fellow in Music at St. Catharine's College (Cambridge, England), and Leverhulme Research Fellow in Far Eastern Historical Musicology at The Queen's University of Belfast (Ireland). She spent a year of fieldwork as a novice in the Gagaku orchestra of Kasuga Taisha in Nara (Japan), and has made other ethnomusicological and archival field trips to Japan and China. She is involved in two international projects: the Tang Music Project (publication series *Music from the Tang Court*, Cambridge University Press) and the Ancient Asian Music Preservation Project at the Library of Congress.

Liang Cai (PhD., Cornell) is an Assistant Professor of History. Her research, on early Confucianism, Daoism, and Chinese intellectual history investigates social historical evidence, including archaeological texts, to re-write the intellectual history of a formative period of Chinese history. She has taught survey courses in both halves of East Asian History as well as courses on Ancient China, Confucianism, perceptions of China and Asia in the West and World history. She has a mastery of classical and modern Chinese as well as Japanese. Dr. Cai taught at Armstrong Atlantic State University in Savannah GA. before coming to the University of Arkansas.

Hoyt Purvis (B.A. and M.J., University of Texas). Hoyt Purvis worked as a reporter for the *Houston Chronicle*, and is the author and editor of a number of books and articles. He is former press secretary and special assistant to Senator J. William Fulbright, as well as foreign and defense policy adviser to Senate Majority Leader Robert Byrd. His research interests include international media, media and government/politics, and cable and media technology. He joined the University of Arkansas in 1982.

Rembrandt Wolpert is Professor of Ethnomusicology. He holds degrees in Sinology, Mongolian Studies, Musicology, and Computer Science from Munich (Germany), Cambridge (England), and Otago (New Zealand) Universities. He held senior research appointments at Peterhouse, Cambridge University (England), the Research Institute for Humanistic Studies, Kyoto University (Japan), the Department of Chinese Studies, Würzburg University (Germany), and was Lecturer in Ethnomusicology at The Queen's University of Belfast (Ireland), Chair and Professor of Ethnomusicology and Systematic Musicology at the University of Amsterdam, before joining the University of Arkansas in 2000. Dr. Wolpert has conducted fieldwork in China, Japan, and Ireland. His research interests include musical grammars, computational tools in (ethno)musicology, historical sources in Far Eastern ethnomusicology, and organology. Together with Dr. Elizabeth Markham he coordinates the International Center for the Study of Early Asian and Middle Eastern Musics at Fulbright College and the Tang Music Project's international web site. Dr. Wolpert's work on Chinese and Japanese historical musical sources connect him to the Music Preservation Project of the Library of Congress, Washington, DC.

Jenny Xu (B.A., Xuzhou Normal University, 1982; M.A., University of Texas

at Austin, 1986). Xu joined the University of Arkansas in 1992 and is currently instructor of Chinese. She has organized many special seminars on Chinese calligraphy, Tibet of China, Chinese cooking, and the laws in China. She received two grants, one from the Teaching Academy and the other from Fulbright College. She is interested in comparative linguistics between English and Chinese and second language teaching methodology. She has developed and taught two new classes (Chinese 3033, Conversation and Chinese 3983, Chinese Culture). Since 1992, five of her students have received Chinese Language Scholarships through National competitions to study in Mainland China and Taiwan. She teaches a special class on Chinese culture at the Jones Family Center each year and she is also involved in the Asian Studies program in the Fulbright Institute of International Relations.

Ka Zeng (B.A., Foreign Affairs College, Beijing, 1992; M.A., Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, 1995; Ph.D., University of Virginia, 2000) is an associate professor. She is the author of *Trade Threats, Trade Wars: Bargaining, Retaliation, and American Coercive Diplomacy* (University of Michigan Press, 2004) and editor of *China's Foreign Trade Policy: The New Constituencies* (Routledge, 2007). She has also published in *International Studies Quarterly*, *the China Quarterly*, *East Asia: An International Quarterly*, and other outlets. Her current research focuses on the domestic sources of international trade, Chinese economic negotiation behavior, and China's harmonization with international law. Dr. Zeng is the faculty advisor for Pi Sigma Alpha.

The AIST Program currently has seven core faculty members. It also has seven associated faculty members that have research interests in Asia from across the campus. We are currently in the process of hiring a Chinese language instructor, with the hope of turning the instructor position into a tenure-track position by 2010. An alternative to the tenure-track Chinese language faculty position would be a joint hire between the Department of Foreign Languages and the Department of English of someone who specializes in Chinese literature.

is around 50 hours of honors coursework. The Fulbright Honors Studies Office with the suggestion of the Fulbright Honors Council is proposing a new Four-Year Scholars curriculum (BA, BSW & BS), giving students the choice between honors and non-honors courses, with a minimum amount of honors in the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.

Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Social Work: Four-Year Honors

Reducing the number of required honors humanities and social sciences from 24 to 15: Students will be required to meet state minimum core and Fulbright College core of 27 hours, but only 15 (16 on the H2P option) of these hours must be taken at the honors level. With the change, six hours of social sciences will be required instead of three.

Reducing the number of required honors natural sciences from 12 to eight hours: Students will be required to complete 12 hours, splitting the sciences between physical and biological with at least eight hours at the honors level.

Reducing Colloquium requirements from 15 to nine, to be chosen from three different colloquia types.

Total number of honors: 32-33, compared to 51 on current Scholar's core

Bachelor of Science: Four-Year Honors

Reducing number of required honors humanities and social sciences from 15 to nine (12 if H2P option): Students will be required to meet state minimum core and Fulbright College core (18-19 hours), but only nine of these hours must be taken at the honors level. With the change, nine hours of fine arts/world literature/humanities/philosophy will be required instead of six.

Reducing number of required honors natural sciences from 18 to 16: Students must take 16 hours of natural sciences at the honors level, to be chosen from two of the five areas, instead of three of the five areas.

Reducing Colloquium requirements from 15 to nine, to be chosen from three different colloquia types.

Total number of honors: 34-37 compared to 45 on current Scholar's core

The proposed changes seek to match the Four-Year Scholars core requirements with the current Fulbright core. For instance, with the current Scholar's core, BA and BSW students only need three hours of social sciences and do not have to disperse their natural sciences between the biological and physical sciences. With the proposed changes, students need six hours of social sciences and must disperse their natural sciences. In addition to the Fulbright core, students will be required to take a minimum of nine hours of honors colloquia. The proposed changes now mirror the current non-honors core requirements, with a few exceptions. Fundamentals of Communication will be waived for Four-Year Scholars, though any BA student who drops honors or switches to Departmental Honors must take the course. To require COMM 1313 would be an increase of nearly 200 students a year needing the course, something the COMM Department could not absorb. By matching the Four-Year Scholars core more closely with current Fulbright core requirements, students who drop honors will have met graduation requirements at the core level.

The proposed honors curriculum changes present several advantages and respond productively to several problems that our Program has encountered for several years. First, by reducing the total number of honors hours required for graduation, we are bringing our own program more in line with honors programs across the country, most of which now require far fewer hours than our Program. This reduction in hours does not reflect a reduction of rigor or quality; conversely, the changes allow for more flexibility in choosing courses across a range of disciplines and therefore more adequately reflect the kind of interdisciplinary work that is becoming more and more commonplace on campuses nationwide. Students, of course, will

still be allowed to take as many honors courses as they wish, and we do not foresee a dwindling interest in our classes; now, however, an ungainly number of required honors courses will not interfere with other class choices they might have otherwise made. Also, as our enrollments have grown, and as our faculty population remains static, our departments are struggling to find creative ways to fill their teaching needs, and rather than compromise the honors classroom by staffing them with unqualified faculty, or by simply not offering the required honors classes, we have felt it advisable to revise slightly our curriculum to meet these pressing and legitimate concerns. Because the students are required to take their humanites, social sciences, and natural sciences at the honors level, the current core offers very little flexibility in scheduling. Moreover, it does not allow for credit through Advanced Placement scores less than 5 to count for anything other than elective hours, in the humanities, social sciences and natural sciences, since these must be taken at the honors level. For a Departmental Honors or non-honors student, credit from AP for a score less than five may result in core credit. The situation is similar for International Baccalaureate scores.

In May 2008, these proposed changes were unanimously approved by the Honors Council, a group of 13 faculty members from Fulbright College.

Students interested in Latin America and wishing to maximize their potential for academic, business, professional, or government careers related

to the area, may earn a combined major or a minor in Latin American studies together with a major in another discipline in Fulbright College. Advice on appropriate combinations of Latin American studies with other majors as well as individual approval of such combinations may be obtained from the LAST program director. New students in this program must officially declare the combined major and notify the LAST program director. Degree checks must also be cleared with the program director. Requirements for a Major in Latin American Studies:

Language Competence: The student must complete SPAN 2013 (or equivalent). Provisions are available for recognition of language skills gained by other means than formal course work taken at the University of Arkansas: See information under the entry in the department of foreign languages. Further functional work in Spanish or Portuguese as well as study and residence in a Latin American nation can serve to strengthen language competence and are encouraged.

Requirements for Honors in LAST: The Honors Program in Latin American studies gives junior and senior students of high ability the opportunity to enroll in enriched courses and conduct independent research culminating in an honors thesis. In addition to satisfying the general Fulbright College requirements for graduation and the basic eligibility requirements for honors as established by the Honors Council, candidates for honors in Latin American studies must complete 12 hours of honors credit in partial satisfaction of requirements for the co-major. One to six of these may be thesis hours (LAST 399VH). The preferred method for satisfying the remaining hours is to enroll in the colloquium at least once for honors credit (LAST 4003H) and to take relevant honors colloquia or graduate courses (with permission) in one of the departments contributing to this interdisciplinary area study. The thesis committee shall include a representative from the major discipline (in the case of multiple majors, from the discipline contributing most significantly to the topic). Successful completion of these requirements will be recognized by the award of the distinction "Latin American Studies Scholar *Cum Laude*" at graduation. The Department of Curriculum and Instruction also offers the B.S.E. in elementary education licensure program. Students enrolled in this program typically complete most or all of the first two years of study at NorthWest Arkansas Community College prior to admission to the program. The final two years of the program are University of Arkansas courses offered at the UA Global Campus in Rogers.

Academic Regulations for Elementary Education Majors are as follows:

Pre-Admission

Students will complete the first two years of study at Northwest Arkansas Community College (NWACC). They will establish a GPA of 2.70 or better in the pre-requisite courses and pass Praxis I. Applicants must also hold a valid CPR card for both children and adults. The deadline for application to the UA course portion of this program and submission of Praxis scores is April 15 prior to Fall enrollment. Once the application materials are received, students will participate in an oral interview with program faculty. Eligibility to enroll in UA program courses is contingent upon successfully completing all requirements in the Pre-Admission phase.

UA Coursework Progression

Students will enroll in UA courses and maintain a GPA of 2.7 or better. They will be required to pass Praxis II: Early Childhood Content Knowledge in the junior year AND Praxis II: Principles of Learning and Teaching, Early Childhood in the senior year. This degree includes approximately 9 months of student teaching experience in a Rogers, Bentonville, or Springdale elementary school. Senior-level students must therefore attend full-time.

NOTE: All professional education courses in CIED must have a grade of "C" or better. No teaching methods courses may be taken by correspondence.

The program in health science is designed to prepare candidates for a variety of career options in the vast field of health education and health promotion. Career opportunities may include planning, development, and delivery of health programs in various settings. These settings may include hospitals, government agencies, non-profit organizations, community organizations, corporations, and other places of occupation. Graduates of this program should be well prepared to enter the work force at an entry level position in community health or graduate programs of study in such areas as health education and health promotion, corporate health, public health, health care administration, and other allied health professional schools.

The candidate for the Bachelor of Science in Education degree with a major in health science will focus on community health. All students must complete the University Core requirements as listed on page 40. In addition, all students must take the courses listed below under required general studies for the health science major and the additional health science major requirements. A minimum of 127 semester hours is required for graduation in the major of health science.

Students enrolled in the program earn an M.S. degree in agricultural economics from the University of Arkansas and an M.S. degree in rural development from a consortium of universities in the E.U. Participation in this two-year program includes U.S. students from the University of Arkansas and E.U. students from a consortium of six universities in Europe (University of Ghent, Ghent, Belgium; Humboldt University, Berlin, Germany; National Institute of Advanced Training and Research in Food and Agronomy, Rennes, France; University of Cordova, Cordova, Spain; University of Pisa, Pisa Italy; and the Slovakian University of Nitra, Nitra, Slovakia).

The program includes five academic terms (four semesters and one summer). U.S. students enroll for at least two terms at the University of Arkansas and for at least two terms at two E.U. universities in the European consortium. E.U. students will enroll for at least two terms at two E.U. universities in the European consortium and at least two terms at the University of Arkansas. Study in both the U.S. and E.U. will include three semesters of graduate coursework, completion of a case study or internship during the summer, and one semester of joint thesis research supervised by U.S. and E.U. faculty.

All coursework, research, and case study/internship will be in English in both the U.S. and E.U. Credit for both degrees will be earned as follows: For U.S. students, (1) courses taken at E.U. "host" universities will earn U.A. credit as AGECS 502V Special Topics which are applied to the "home" AGECS degree; (2) courses taken at the U.A. will be transferred to the E.U. consortium for credit towards the "host" E.U. degree in rural development. For E.U. students, (3) courses taken at the U.A. "host" university will earn E.U. credit which is applied to the "home" M.S. in rural development degree; (4) courses taken in the E.U. will be transferred to the U.A. for credit towards the "host" AGECS degree. As with other current concentrations for the AGECS degree at the U.A., the Atlantis track will require 31 semester credit hours. Upon successful completion of the program, U.S. and E.U. students receive an M.S. degree in agricultural economics from the University of Arkansas, and an M.S. degree in rural development from the consortium of EU universities.

During the past three years, the Department of Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness (AEAB) has had an agreement with the University of Ghent in Belgium which allows our M.S. students to spend a semester at Ghent as part of their graduate studies. In July 2008, AEAB was awarded a \$448,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Education, Foundation for the Improvement of Post-Secondary Education (FIPSE), to initiate a double masters degree program with a consortium of six universities in the European Union (EU). The European universities received an equivalent grant from the EU to facilitate this program. This US-EU Atlantis Double Degree Program enhances our current M.S. degree in agricultural economics and gives our students an opportunity to earn a second MS degree in rural development from the European consortium. The total program consortium involves the University of Arkansas and the University of Florida in the U.S. and the following universities in Europe.

The University of Arkansas is the lead university in the U.S. and the University of Ghent is the lead university in Europe. Students will spend approximately two academic years in this program, with up to 12 months spent abroad. All students will write a thesis. EU students will study at either Arkansas or Florida. US students will study at two of the consortium

universities in Europe. The grant provides funding for student and faculty mobility. Upon successful completion of the program the students will receive an MS degree from either Arkansas or Florida AND an MS degree from the European consortium.

Implementation of this program requires the establishment of a new Atlantis M.S. concentration towards the AGECMS degree. The proposed Atlantis concentration differs from the current traditional M.S. thesis concentration in that it requires extended study in the E.U. with different course requirements. The proposed Atlantis concentration also differs from the current international agribusiness M.S. option in that it requires a thesis and enrollment in at least two E.U. universities. However, the most important difference between the proposed Atlantis concentrtrion and the current AGECMS concentrations is that this program: (1) results in double M.S. degrees for both U.S. and E.U. participants; (2) it provides for E.U. students to earn an M.S. degree in agricultural economics at the U.A. with credit hours transferred in from the E.U. consortium of universities; and, (3) it provides for U.A. students to earn an M.S. degree in rural development from the E.U. consortium with credit hours transferred out from the U.A. to the E.U.

The new Atlantis concentration for the AGECMS degree will not require the development of new courses either in the AEAB department nor in other departments on the U.A. campus. Funding from the grant allows three U.S. students to study abroad annually and three E.U. students to study at U.A. resulting in an anticipated zero-sum net change in enrollments. However, the international experience gained by U.A. students during study abroad, and the gains from E.U. students in U.A. classes gives promise of many opportunities for students, faculty, and the university.
