3. State Minimum Core requirements with regard to Fine Arts and Humanities are changed so that students are not required to complete ARTS1003. The new requirement is for students to choose 6 hours from courses that meet the Fine Arts and Humanities requirements of the State Minimum Core.
4. HESC3203 Nutrition/Health Prof \& Educ will no longer be included in the course requirements.
5. The following courses will be new requirements:
a. HESC2402/2401L Infant \& Toddler Development and Lab
b. HESC3423 Adolescent Development
c. HESC3443 Families in Crisis
d. HESC4433 Dynamic Family Interaction
e. A choice of HESC2123 Catering Management (Prereq: HESC1603) or HESC2203 Nutrition for Exercise Sport. Previously, students were limited to only completing HESC2123.
f. A choice of HESC4813 Human Factors in ID (Prereq: Permission) or CATE4803 Problems in CATE (Housing) Previously, students were limited to only completing HESC4813

The program in kinesiology is designed to prepare candidates for a variety of career options in the vast field of movement science. Career opportunities may include teaching physical education, coaching, analyzing and prescribing fitness programs, athletic training, or preparation for professional programs in allied health. Graduates of this program should be well prepared to enter graduate programs of study in such areas as pedagogy or adapted physical education, exercise physiology, biomechanics, athletic training, sport management,
medical school, physical therapy school, and other allied health professional schools.
The candidate for the Bachelor of Science in Education degree with a
major in kinesiology must select one of three concentrations:

Cut off dates for presenting passing Praxis scores are July 1 for the Fall semester, December 1 for the Spring semester and May 1 for any Summer session. Students are required to (1) have a "C" or better in all KINS/PHED Teacher Education classes in order to be eligible to enroll in the Senior Block Internship semester, (2) must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or greater or a minimum 2.75 grade point average in KINS/PHED Teacher Education classes, and (3) completed or registered to take the Praxis II content knowledge exam in order to enter the senior block.
