Bill Springer called the meeting to order at 2:30P.M.

1. The minutes for the October 23, 2009 meeting were approved.
2. Course Change Proposals:
A. Undergraduate and School of Law course change proposals (Tables A \& D) were approved without opposition and forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
B. Graduate and Dual course change proposals (Tables B \& C) were approved without opposition and forwarded for the December Graduate Council meeting.
C. Courses Inactive more than three years - to Remain Active - Table E were approved and will be forwarded for the December Graduate Council meeting.
D. Courses Inactive more than three years - to be Deleted - Table F were approved and will be forwarded for the December Graduate Council meeting.

4. New Business:
A. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Arts and Sciences Dean's Office - European Studies Combined Major (Table One, Attachment 1A) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to add
a study abroad requirement for the degree. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
B. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Arts and Sciences Dean's Office - European Studies Combined Major (Table One, Attachment 1B) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to allow Russian Studies program courses to be included in the European Studies program. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
C. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Arts and Sciences Dean's Office - EUST-M - Minor in European Studies (Table One, Attachment 1C) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to add a study abroad requirement for the minor. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
D. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Arts and Sciences Dean's Office - IRELBA - BA, International Relations (Table One, Attachment 1D) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to remove the European Studies Minor as an option for the degree and require International Relation majors who have the European Studies as their discipline-specific specialty to complete the requirement of a full semester study abroad experience. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
E. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Department of Computer Science and Computer Engineering - CSCEBA - BA, Computer Science (Table One, Attachment 1E) was presented by Susan Gauch. The program change requested to increase the hours needed to graduate from 124 to 125 and many changes in electives. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
F. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Department of History - HISTBA - BA, History (Table One, Attachment 1F) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to change the groupings of History courses that form major requirements and remove Western Civilization I and II courses that satisfy course requirements for the history major. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
G. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Department of World Languages, Literatures and Cultures - JPBO-M - Minor in Japanese with Business Orientation (Table One, Attachment 1G) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to divide required courses into three
categories and add two courses to the elective listing. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
H. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Department of Mathematical Sciences - MATHBA - BA, Mathematics (Table One, Attachment 1H) was presented by Janet Woodland. The program change requested to require eligibility for MATH 2554 as a requirement to declare for the MATHBA degree, eliminate the Senior Writing Project, MATH 400(1) and replace MATH 3083, Linear Algebra, with MATH 3093, Abstract Linear Algebra. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
I. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Department of Mathematical Sciences - MATHBS - BS, Mathematics (Table One, Attachment 1I) was presented by Janet Woodland. The program change requested to require eligibility for MATH 2554 as a requirement to declare for the MATHBS degree, require MATH 2701 and MATH 3093 and remove MATH 3083 as requirements for the degree. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
J. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Department of Political Science - PLSCBA - BA, Political Science (Table One, Attachment 11) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to remove the specified list of PLSC "groups" of classes under the requirements for a major in Political Science. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
K. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Department of Psychology - AP Credit for PSYC 2003 (Table One, Attachment 1K) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to not allow credit for PSYC 2003H utilizing the AP Test results. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
L. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Arts and Sciences Dean's Office - Pre-Professional Programs - PRPA and PRRDTH - PrePhysician Assistant and Pre-Radiation Therapy (Table One, Attachment 1L and Attachment 1M) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to add two pre-professional programs in the pre-professional and pre-allied health tracks. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
M. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, Arts and Sciences Dean's Office - Pre-Professional Programs - PRCYTO, PRDMS, PROMT and PRRC - Pre-Cytotechnology, Pre-Diagnostic Medical Sonography, Pre-Ophthalmic

Medical Technology and Pre-Respiratory Care (Table One, Attachment 1N, Attachment 10, Attachment 1P and Attachment 1Q) was presented by Chuck Adams as an informational item only. The program change requested to change the alpha code designator for each program. The proposal will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
N. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions, Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance - HLSCBS - BSE, Health Science (Table Two, Attachment 2A) was presented by Susan Mayes. The program change requested to add HLSC 4613, Principles of Epidemiology, as an option for HLSC 4623, Human Diseases. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
O. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions, Department of Health Science, Kinesiology, Recreation and Dance - KINSBS - BSE, Kinesiology (Table Two, Attachment 2B) was presented by Susan Mayes. The program change requested to change the options for HLSC electives. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 9, 2009 Faculty Senate meeting.
P. Proposed graduate program change for the Department of Drama - DRAMMA - MA, Drama (Table Three, Attachment 3A and Attachment 3B) was presented by Chuck Adams. The program change requested to delete the program. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the December 2009 Graduate Council meeting.
5. Other Business:

As an informational item, Lisa Kulczak informed the committee of the Registrar's intention to use GFFT 500 as a dummy class to indicate that a student receiving a research fellowship should be considered full-time. The Graduate School has a policy of treating most fellowship-only recipients (NSF, SMART, GEM, IGERT, etc) the same as graduate assistants with respect to enrollment requirements. Having this additional designation would allow the policy to be applied uniformly. There was no discussion following the presentation.

It is impossible to gain genuine expertise in European Studies without spending an extended period of time working and living in a non-Anglophone European country. An increasing number of our peer institutions (notably the University of Oklahoma and the University of Texas-Austin) have begun to require students majoring in European Studies to undertake an extended study abroad period (at least six weeks) in order to more completely familiarize themselves with the practical and cultural realities of living in Europe. At the University of Arkansas, approximately $75 \%$ of the current EUST majors have or plan to undertake such an experience. However, these are often students with a modern European language as their co-major. The students who co-major in non-language specialties such as IR (our largest joint major) PLSC, HIST or GEOG are less likely to go abroad and when they do, they overwhelmingly concentrate on studies in Britain and Ireland. While this experience is not useless, it is not truly a European experience as both those countries have become increasingly Americanized over the last 30 years. The requirement that such students use the $U$ of $A$ Rome program as their approved study abroad option solves this problem by immersing the students in an English language teaching environment, with instructors who are familiar to them, and a foreign language living environment. In addition, all the classes offered to the students at the Rome program will be EUST classes. This solves a long standing problem of students being unable to transfer all their study abroad credits back into EUST because they are transferred in as HIST, FLAN or other departmental credits of which only a limited number of hours can qualify for EUST.
Not all students will be required to go to Rome, any student with a major or minor in a modern European language will be able to choose a program in the country of their language specialization. It will also be possible for students to choose another European program if they have a compelling academic reason to be in a country other than Italy (such as a program that aids with honors thesis research).
The EUST program is planning several initiatives to reduce the financial burden that this new requirement will place on students. We are proposing to allow students to pay the Rome Center program fee over a period of four or six semesters and to have that fee attached to student accounts in such a way as it allows them to include it in theor financial aid packges. In addition we are planning a fund drive to raise scholarship money that will be dedicated to this program. it should also be noted that a large number of the EUST students are honors students and have access to substantial study abroad and academic scholarships.

These changes are desired to coordinate with the proposed study abroad requirement being made in the European Studies area studies program. Students who major in International Relations and specify their discipline specialty (proposed to be a co-major in lieu of the minor) in European Studies (all International Relations majors are currently required to select a minor in one of 10 selected disciplines: anthropology, economics, geography, history, political science, Asian studies, European studies, Latin American and Latino studies, and Middle East studies) will be required to participate in the University of Arkansas Rome program for at least one semester as do all European Studies co-majors. (Exceptions noted below.)

It is impossible to gain genuine expertise in European Studies without spending an extended period of time working and living in a non-Anglophone European country. An increasing number of our peer institutions (notably the University of Oklahoma and the University of Texas-Austin) have begun to require students majoring in European Studies to undertake an extended study abroad period (at least six weeks) in order to more completely familiarize themselves with the practical and cultural realities of living in Europe. At the University of Arkansas, approximately $75 \%$ of the current EUST majors have or plan to undertake such an experience; however, these are often students with a modern European language as their co-maior. The students who co-major in non-language specialties such as IR (our largest joint major) PLSC, HIST or GEOG are less likely to go abroad and when they do, they overwhelmingly concentrate on studies in Britain and Ireland. While this experience is not useless, it is not truly a European experience as both those countries have become increasingly Americanized over the last 30 years. The requirement that such students use the $U$ of A Rome program as their approved study abroad option solves this problem by immersing the students in an English language teaching environment, with instructors who are familiar to them, and a foreign language living environment. In addition, all the classes offered to the students at the Rome program will be EUST classes. This solves a long standing problem of students being unable to transfer all their study abroad credits back into EUST because they are transferred in as HIST, FLAN or other departmental credits of which only a limited number of hours can qualify for EUST.
Not all students will be required to go to Rome; any student with a major or minor in a modern European language will be able to choose a program in the country of their language specialization. It will also be possible for students to choose another European program if they have a compelling academic reason to be in a country other than Italy (such as a program that aids with honors thesis research).
The EUST program is planning several initiatives to reduce the financial burden that this new requirement will place on students. We are proposing to allow students to pay the Rome Center program fee over a period of four or six semesters and to have that fee attached to student accounts in such a way as it allows them to include it in their financial aid packges. In addition we are planning a fund drive to raise scholarship money that will be dedicated to this program. it should also be noted that a large number of the EUST students are honors students and have access to substantial study abroad and academic scholarships.

The courses MATH 2701 and MATH 3093 are designed to help our students transition into the higher level abstract courses: Math 2701 serves as an introduction to the culture and methods of the world of mathematics-which are quite different than the expectations of many math majors! In addition this course is designed to draw students closer into the life of the department; there will be social activities, ties to the math club and future teachers club, etc, and presentations on careers, undergraduate research opportunities.

Math 3093 replaces Math 3083; both cover Linear Algebra, but 3093 emphasizes proof and abstraction, preparing students for the abstract perpsective that awaits them in their higher level course work.

Requiring at least eligibility for Math 2554 or a higher course to declare a major is intended to ensure a certain minimal mathematical maturity of our majors. We often have students declare a math major while enrolled in College Algebra or even MATH 0003 (!) simply because it is one subject they've heard of since elementary school. This is usually highly unrealistic, and distracts the department from identifying and focusing our attention on students who are more likely to actually remain math majors.

The courses MATH 2701 and MATH 3093 are designed to help our students transition into the higher level abstract courses: Math 2701 serves as an introduction to the culture and methods of the world of mathematics-which are quite different than the expectations of many math majors! In addition this course is designed to draw students closer into the life of the department; there will be social activities, ties to the math club and future teachers club, etc, and presentations on careers, undergraduate research opportunities.

Math 3093 replaces Math 3083; both cover Linear Algebra, but 3093 emphasizes proof and abstraction, preparing students for the abstract perpsective that awaits them in their higher level course work.

Requiring at least eligibility for Math 2554 or a higher course to declare a major is intended to ensure a certain minimal mathematical maturity of our majors. We often have students declare a math major while enrolled in College Algebra or even MATH 0003 (!) simply because it is one subject they've heard of since elementary school. This is usually highly unrealistic, and distracts the department from identifying and focusing our attention on students who are more likely to actually remain math majors.
