Terry Martin called the meeting to order at 2:32P.M.

- 1. The minutes for the December 18, 2009 meeting were approved.
- 2. Course Change Proposals:

Two courses were removed from Table A for additional discussion:

ENGL 2003 and HESC 4673

ENGL 2003, Advanced English, was tabled until a representative from the College of Arts and Sciences or the Department of English could be present to address content concerns.

HESC 4673, Destination Marketing & Operations, was proposed to move from an undergraduate course only to a dual level course. The course was tabled because there were no changes in content from the previous course.

- A. The remaining Undergraduate and School of Law course change proposals (<u>Tables A & D</u>) were approved without opposition and forwarded for the February 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.
- B. Graduate and Dual course change proposals (<u>Tables B & C</u>) were approved without opposition and forwarded for the February Graduate Council meeting.

- C. Courses with no enrollment in the last 5 years to remain active <u>Table E</u> was approved without opposition and forwarded for consideration at the February Graduate Council meeting.
- D. Courses with no enrollment in the last 5 years to be inactivated/deleted <u>Table F</u> was approved without opposition and forwarded for consideration at the February Graduate Council meeting.

4. New Business:

- 1. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Bumpers College of Agriculture, Food and Life Sciences, Department of Food Science FDSCBS- BSA, Food Science (<u>Table One</u>, <u>Attachment 1A</u>, and <u>Attachment 1B</u>) was presented by **Donna Graham**. The program change requested to delete AGEC2103 or ECON 2103 as required courses, replace ECON 2023 with ECON 2143, and replace WCOB 2033 with MGMT 3563. Bill Curington assured the committee that these changes presented no problems for the Walton College of Business. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for the February 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.
- 2. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences,
 Department of Computer Science and Compute Engineering CSCE-M, Minor in Computer Science
 (<u>Table Two</u>, <u>Attachment 2A</u>) was presented by **Terry Martin**. The program change requested to remove
 CSCE 3143, 3313, 2213 and 4313 as required courses and replace them with CSCE 2004, 2014, 3193 and
 three additional CSCE courses numbered 2000 and above. The proposal was approved without
 opposition and will be forwarded for the February 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.

5. Other Business:

At the conclusion of the meeting a spirited discussion developed concerning the routing of courses being approved for use in the "University Core" by the University Core Committee that flow to the Faculty Senate meeting without being presented to the UCPC. Since any change in the "University Core" will probably result in program changes it was thought that this presented a problem for the dissemination of information to the colleges. Ro DiBrezzo said that she would carry this concern to the Faculty Senate Executive Committee.

Food science deals with all aspects of food between production and consumption and involves many disciplines, including chemistry, microbiology, nutrition, engineering and sensory science.

Food science prepares students for many interesting, rewarding and challenging professional career opportunities in industry, business, governmental and educational organizations associated with food and food-related products. Due to the diversity and abundance of opportunities available, students graduating with a B.S.A. in food science readily obtain employment or continue studies for graduate school. Additionally, requirements for several pre-professional programs can be fulfilled while meeting requirements for the food science degree.

Students may choose one of two areas of concentration for their degree program: Food Science (FDSC) or Food Technology (FDTN). The FDSC concentration at the University of Arkansas is one of only 53 programs in the United States and the only one in Arkansas that is approved by the Institute of Food Technologists. It provides students with a strong background in basic and applied sciences and food chemistry, microbiology, analysis, quality and engineering.

The FDTN concentration provides students interested in food business and management careers with an integrated background in food

science and business. With proper course selection, students in the rood technology concentration can complete a minor in
agribusiness or general business while completing their core requirements, thus leaving elective hours available for further educational
enhancement.
