The program change requested to allow students who exempt from ENGL 1013 and ENGL 1023 to enroll in general elective hours rather than additional English or communication hours and added AGE 4163, Agricultural and Rural Development, to the specialization course listing for the Agribusiness Management and Marketing concentration. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for consideration at the March 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.
- C. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Bumpers College of Agriculture, Food and Life Sciences, Department of Crop, Soil and Environmental Sciences – ESWSBS –

BSA, Environmental Soil and Water Science ([Table 1, Attachment 1C](#)) was presented by Tim Killian. The proposal requested to change the requirement of CHEM 2613/2611L, Organic Physiological Chemistry to CHEM 2613/2611L or CHEM 3603/3601L, Organic Chemistry I. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for consideration at the March 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.

- D. Proposed undergraduate program change for the Bumpers College of Agriculture, Food and Life Sciences, School of Human Environmental Sciences – HDFBS – BSHES, Human Development, Family Sciences and Rural Sociology, all concentrations ([Table 1, Attachment 1M](#)) was presented by Tim Killian. The proposal requested to change the name of one course and combine HESC2402/2401L into one class HESC 2403. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for consideration at the March 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.

Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions, Department of Curriculum and Instruction – CATEBS – BSE, Career and Technical Education ([Table 2, Attachment 2A](#)) was withdrawn from consideration by Janet Penner-Williams. The proposal will be revised and resubmitted at a later date.
- F. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions, Department of Curriculum and Instruction – CHEDBS – BSE, Childhood Education ([Table 2, Attachment 2B](#)) was presented by Janet Penner-Williams and Heather Kindall. The program change requested to delete HLSC 1002, Wellness Concepts and replace it with 2 hours of a wellness-based course. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for consideration at the March 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.
- G. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Education and Health Professions, Department of Curriculum and Instruction – ELELBS – BSE, Elementary Education ([Table 2, Attachment 2C](#)) was presented by Janet Penner-Williams and Heather Kindall. The program change requested to delete HLSC 1002, Wellness Concepts and replace it with 2 hours of a wellness-based course to include PEAC courses, First Aid or First Responder; delete ARHS, Art Appreciation, or Art 1033, Intro to Art Studio, and replace them with 3 hours from the “University Core” Fine Arts area. The proposal was approved without opposition and will be forwarded for consideration at the March 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.
- H. Proposed undergraduate program change for the College of Engineering, Civil Engineering Department – CVEGBS – BSCE, Civil Engineering ([Table 3, Attachment 3A](#)) was presented by William Springer. The program change requested to delete MEEG 2003, Statics, MEEG 3013, Strength of Materials, and GEOL 3002, Geology for Engineers, and add CVEG 2014 and GEOL1113/1111L. The proposal was approved without

opposition and will be forwarded for consideration at the March 10, 2010 Faculty Senate meeting.

- I. There were no graduate program changes.
2. Other Business:

An item for **discussion only** was forwarded from the General Education Core Curriculum Committee. The proposal was meant to better define and establish a University Wide Diversity Requirement. No representative was present to formally present the proposal. However, Ro DiBrezza who is a member of that committee as well as the University Course and Programs Committee introduced the proposal, Attachments One and Two. After a spirited discussion, the committee voted to respond to the General Education Core Committee with a narrative which is to be developed by Chuck Adams. The narrative would be sent to the committee by email. Following revision, the committee would vote for approval before the response would be sent to the General Education Core Committee. If consensus is not obtained by the March meeting, then the response will be returned as an item under old business.

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction offers programs that prepare candidates for initial teacher licensure in Childhood Education. The B.S.E. degree in Childhood Education is not an initial teacher licensure program but instead leads to the Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.), which is the initial teacher licensure preparation program. Information about the M.A.T. degree program can be found in the University of Arkansas Graduate Catalog. Candidates seeking entry into the Childhood Education program will be advised in the Boyer Center for Student Services until admission to the junior year of the program, at which time they will be assigned a faculty adviser.

Admission to the B.S.E. in Childhood Education is limited and consists of a three-stage process.

Stage I: Pre-Childhood Education

1. Complete all program pre-requisites including the first 62 or 63 hours of the 8-semester plan (see 8-semester table below)
2. Obtain a minimum of 2.7 GPA on the 62 or 63 hours of pre-requisite courses, either from the UA or on transfer coursework.
3. Complete the following courses with a "C" or better: CIED 1002/1011, MATH 1203, ENGL 1013, and ENGL 1023.
4. Obtain a passing score on the Math, Reading, and Writing sections of the Praxis I.

Stage II: Admission to the Childhood Education Program

Admission to the Childhood Education Program occurs after completion of all Pre-Childhood Education requirements and prior to the beginning of the fall semester of the junior year. Applications to the Childhood Education (ELED) program must be submitted by January 30th.

The application process includes:

1. Submission of Childhood Education application.
2. Submission of transcripts for all coursework.
3. Oral Interview.
4. Submission of Writing and Editing Samples.
5. Submission of passing score on Math, Reading, and Writing sections of Praxis I Exam.

Stage III: Requirements for Progression to Senior Coursework.

1. Declaration of endorsement area of ESL or SPED.
2. Cumulative GPA of 2.7.
3. All non-methods math, science, social studies and HESC courses as well as CIED 3003/3001 and CIED 3263 must be completed prior to senior year.

Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.)

The Masters of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) is the degree that leads to initial teacher licensure. This is a graduate program and applicants must meet the admission requirements of the Graduate School. Applicants must have completed all requirements for the B.S.E. by the end of spring semester to be considered for admission into the M.A.T., which is a year-long field-based degree that starts during the summer prior to the regular fall-spring academic year.

M.A.T. candidates will be advised by faculty advisers.

Admission requirements:

1. Admission to the University of Arkansas Graduate School.
2. Submission of M.A.T. Application.
3. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 on the last 60 hours of coursework. Including any transfer work or grade forgiveness.
4. Passing score on Praxis II, Early Childhood: Content Knowledge (10022).
5. Passing score on M.A.T. entrance portfolio.
6. Successful interview with M.A.T. admission committee.

On campus this course is being discontinued through the HLSC department and, in order uphold continuity, we would prefer to remove the requirement in our off campus ELEL program. In addition, to better meet the requirements of Act 182, the program is attempting to broaden the courses that we will require during the Freshmen and Sophomore year. The proposed change regarding the removal of ARHS 1003 or ART 1033 is being made to more closely align the off campus program requirements with those of our on campus program in CHED. This change will also serve students in regard to Act 182 in a similar way as the first change. In the ELEL program, all Freshmen and Sophomore level courses are taken at NorthWest Arkansas Community College (NWACC) so these deletions and additions will not effect any departments or their course offerings on the University of Arkansas campus.

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction also offers the B.S.E. in elementary education licensure program. Students enrolled in this program typically complete all or most of their first two years of study at NorthWest Arkansas Community College (NWACC) prior to admission to the program. The final two years of the program are University of Arkansas courses offered at the University of Arkansas Global Campus in Rogers, Arkansas.

Academic Requirements for Elementary Education Majors

Pre-Admission:

Candidates will complete the first two years of study at NorthWest Arkansas Community College. They will establish a GPA of 2.70 or better in the prerequisite courses and pass Praxis I. Applicants must also hold a valid CPR card for both children and adults. The deadline for application to the University of Arkansas course portion of this program and submission of Praxis scores is April 15 prior to fall enrollment. Once the application materials are received, candidates will participate in an oral interview with program faculty. Eligibility to enroll in University of Arkansas courses is contingent upon successfully completing all requirements in the Pre-Admission phase.

University of Arkansas Coursework Progression

Candidates will enroll in University of Arkansas courses and maintain a GPA of 2.7 or better. They will be required to pass both Praxis II: Early Childhood Content Knowledge in the junior year and Praxis II: Principles of Learning and Teaching Early Childhood in the senior year. This degree includes approximately 9 months of student teaching experiences in a Rogers, Bentonville, or Springdale elementary school. Senior level candidates must therefore attend full-time.

Changes (1) and (2) as listed in Section V shift the responsibility for instruction (to civil engineering undergraduates) in basic engineering mechanics (Statics and Mechanics of Materials) to the Department of Civil Engineering. Currently, civil engineering students take these courses from the Department of Mechanical Engineering. The subjects/courses are pre-requisites for CVEG 3304, Structural Analysis, as well as numerous other civil engineering courses. Student performance related to these subjects is assessed (primarily) using two metrics: (1) scores on the Statics and Mechanics subject areas of the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) Examination -- a nationally-normed common exam for all engineering students; and (2) scores on a start-of-semester proficiency exam administered in CVEG 3304. Student scores on both these metrics, which have been tracked for over 10 years, continue to indicate a basic lack of understanding of these foundational topics. It is felt that the proposed course will allow the faculty and students to better integrate critical civil engineering related concepts into advanced-level design and analysis courses.

Changes (3) and (4) as listed in Section V simplifies scheduling for students, gives more flexibility in completion of the program and a more thorough overview of the necessary concepts in Geology required for the Civil Engineering program.
